



DH Methods Bootcamp: Text, Data, and Archives

Two-Day Workshop and Research Project Colloquium



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The exponential growth of digital data has transformed how scholars and practitioners in the humanities and social sciences conduct research. Textual corpora, bibliometric databases, and digitised archival collections now enable new approaches for computational interpretation, network analysis, and data-driven storytelling. The Digital Humanities (DH) framework enables researchers to combine traditional interpretive methods with computational techniques, allowing them to explore large-scale textual corpora, visual datasets, and archival materials. The two-day programme, Digital Research Methods for Text, Data, and Archives, combined with a PhD–Masters–DH Research Project Colloquium, offers a comprehensive introduction to contemporary DH tools, methods, and research applications. Designed for scholars across disciplines, the event aims to develop methodological competency, promote collaborative research communities, and support early-stage researchers in building sustainable DH projects.
